### AA Members Unite, Setup Superb Course

Saturday's AA match repeated the Kentucky Bluegrass format as used in September in preparation for the Lexington regional match. Again, rather than shooting the wooded lanes, the open field used for paper target zeroing was set up with six 50 yard lanes. Two to three field targets were set up on each grassy lane for a 30 shot round. After the morning round, the group gathered for a BBQ lunch catered by David Still's company, ProSelect Resources, Inc.. After allowing lunch to settle, the competitors returned to freshly painted field targets to begin the second round.

In Ken Hughes' absence, the entire attending membership pitched in to set up a challenging 60 shot course. As before, the course was set with shooting lanes at a 90 degree angle to the standard paper target lanes introducing a rolling hill effect.

Lane 2 required off-hand shooting with the introduction of three small logs arranged to require a 10 yard kneeling or standing shot. This lane also required a 45 yard shot with the target viewed through grass. Unlike September's match, the grass was a bit higher this time and required some competitors to shoot in a kneeling or standing position, otherwise the pellet trajectory would be affected by protruding grass.

The shooting conditions were perfect. There was a little wind at the beginning of the match that later completely disappeared. Again, the change of course format was a hit with the members with the exception of the grass-hidden targets. Of course, for this match we were not wishing for wind.

Six shooters attended the AA match. David Still won the match with a score of 46 of 60 shots (76.7%). In the first round, David
