## Needed changes are taking place now

Our sight-in range has always been a central focus point of our club every weekend. It provides the necessary tools to ensure a good match but there have been some things lacking that are now being addressed. The plinking factor has often been missing from our time on the range. Reactive targets like spinners and our field targets provide a bit of competition and fun while helping you get settled in for the upcoming match. They also help us unwind after the last target drops on the lanes.

Ken Hughes has completed a new bell target with a great little 1/2" or so "kill zone" attached to the clapper. We were playing with it last match at about 50 yards and it was proving to be quite a challenge to say the least. Walt Roller has been working on some new

spinner targets, and additional targets are being added as time and creativity permits. Perhaps even some Silhouette rounds might make it into our competitions if it fits the budgets and there is enough interest.

Walt Roller has also helped us out with some hardware for some needed range markers as well. We have installed removable range markers every yard from 8 to 55 yards to help with sight-in as well as scope setup. They are removable to aid in the grass and weed management on the range.

Ken Hughes recently purchased four wind flags from Stylee Edwards and is in the process of determining how to best place them on the range to keep them safe and easy to see. We used them for part of our zero time on the range this month and found them to be a superb addition. Stylee does great work and provides these at a very reasonable price.

## Directions to Matches

- Travel I-20 East to Exit 93 (Hazelbrand), turn right on Hazelbrand.
- After 1 mile, turn left on Hwy 278. (first major intersection)
- Drive approximately 2.3 miles and bear right on Hwy 142. (after the bridge)
- Drive approximately 3.5 miles, turn right on Woodlawn Road. (immediately after the horse farm and the 4J Arena sign)
- Drive approximately 0.5 miles to 1865 Woodlawn. (on right)
- Proceed through wooden gate and bear left on dirt road past travel trailer.
- Travel down the dirt road and through the wooded area for approximately 200 yards.
- At the open field (sight-in range), park anywhere.
